- Wear correct Redcliffe City Physic class attire at all times
- Maintain excellent attendance in your own physic class and the class you help in
- Stay alert, engaged and positive throughout the entire class
- Maintain energy and enthusiasm throughout the entire class
- Demonstrate all skills, routines and exercises to an excellent standard
- Continued development of your own physic skills
- Participate in all Redcliffe City Physic competitions/performances
- Assist in making simple corrections with guidance from associate teachers
- Learn all student's names and assist with keeping student's focused and engaged during classes



#### **Code of Conduct for RCP Class Helpers**

- **1.** Encourage students to participate, don't force them. Remember that students participate for fun and that winning is only part of the fun.
- **2.** Be reasonable in your demands on young people's time, energy, enthusiasm and attention span.
- 3. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake.
- **4.** Give all students equal opportunities to participate and ensure that they get equal time and attention from you regardless of their abilities.
- 5. Remember that students learn best by following your example
- **6.** Teach students positive sporting behaviour as well as the basics. Remember, you set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be positive and supportive.
- 7. Reward good behaviour.
- **8.** Condemn all unsporting behaviour from competitors and parents.
- 9. Be open to feedback about your assisting
- 10. Be helpful and advise an Associate Teacher if there are problems or if help is needed for any reason
- 11. Be loyal to your club and respect it
- 12. Enjoy yourself and have fun
